

1.75yr Partial Principal at Risk Capped Notes linked to EFA/SX5E

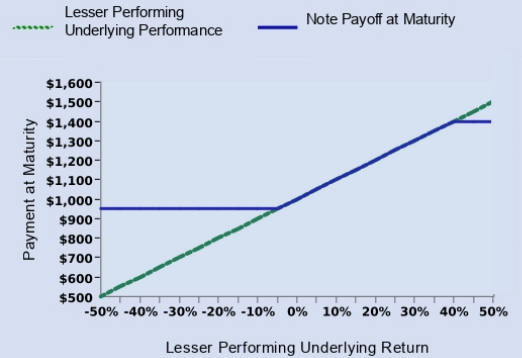

Selected Risks (continued)
