## General

- The notes are designed for investors who seek an interest rate that is higher than the current dividend yield on the applicable Reference Stock or the yield on a conventional debt security with the same maturity issued by us or an issuer with a comparable credit rating. Investors should be willing to forgo the potential to participate in the appreciation of the applicable Reference Stock, be willing to accept the risks of owning the common stock of the applicable Reference Stock issuer, and be willing to lose some or all of their principal at maturity.

## Selected Purchase Considerations

## THE NOTES OFFER A HIGHER INTEREST RATE THAN THE YIELD ON DEBT SECURITIES OF COMPARABLE MATURITY ISSUED

 BY US OR AN ISSUER WITH A COMPARABLE CREDIT RATING - The notes will pay interest at an Interest Rate depending upon the applicable Reference Stock, as indicated on the cover of this pricing supplement. The applicable Interest Rate is higher than the yield currently available on debt securities of comparable maturity issued by us or an issuer with a comparable credit rating. Because the notes are our senior unsecured obligations, any interest payment or any payment at maturity is subject to our ability to pay our obligations as they become due.MONTHLY INTEREST PAYMENTS - The notes offer monthly interest payments at the applicable Interest Rate set forth on the cover of this pricing supplement. Interest will be payable monthly in arrears on the last calendar day of each month, up to and including the final monthly interest payment which will be payable on the Maturity Date (each such date, an "Interest Payment Date"), commencing November 30, 2011, to the holders of record at the close of business on the business day immediately preceding the applicable Interest Payment Date. If an Interest Payment Date is not a business day, payment will be made on the next business day immediately following such day, but no additional interest will accrue as a result of the delayed payment. For example, the monthly interest payment due December 2011 will be payable on January 3, 2012.
THE NOTES DO NOT GUARANTEE THE RETURN OF YOUR PRINCIPAL - We will pay you your principal back at maturity so long as the applicable Final Share Price is not less than the applicable Initial Share Price or the closing price of the applicable Reference Stock is not less than the applicable Initial Share Price by more than the applicable Protection Amount on any day during the Monitoring Period.

TAX TREATMENT AS A UNIT COMPRISING A PUT OPTION AND A DEPOSIT - You should review carefully the section entitled "Certain U.S. Federal Income Tax Consequences" in the accompanying product supplement no. 34-A-II. By purchasing the notes, you agree (in the absence of an administrative determination or judicial ruling to the contrary) to treat (i) the notes as units comprising a Put Option and a Deposit for U.S. federal income tax purposes and (ii) the percentages of each coupon payment specified on the cover of this pricing supplement as interest on the Deposit and as Put Premium, respectively. We will follow this approach in determining our information reporting responsibilities, if any. The payment at maturity will be based on the applicable Final Share Price and whether the closing price of the applicable Reference Stock is less than the applicable Initial Share Price by more than the applicable Protection Amount on any day during the Monitoring Period. Under certain circumstances, you will receive at maturity a predetermined number of shares of the applicable Reference Stock (or, at our election, the Cash Value thereof). The market value of those shares of the applicable Reference Stock or the Cash Value thereof will most likely be less than the principal amount of each note and may be zero. The Canadian dollar has been subject to fluctuations against the U.S. dollar in the past, and may be subject to significant fluctuations in the future. Previous fluctuations or periods of relative stability in the exchange rate of the Canadian dollar and the U.S. dollar are not necessarily indicative of fluctuations or periods of relative stability in those rates that may occur over the term of the notes linked to the common stock of Silver Wheaton. The exchange rate between the Canadian dollar and the U.S. dollar is the result of the supply of, and the demand for, those currencies. Changes in the exchange rate result over time from the interaction of many factors directly or indirectly affecting economic and political conditions in Canada and the United States, including economic and political developments in other countries.
