JPMorgan Chase & Co. Trigger Return Optimization Securities \$8,376,820 Linked to the EURO STOXX 50[®] Index due August 31, 2018

Investment Description

Trigger Return Optimization Securities, which we refer to as the "Securities," are unsecured and unsubordinated debt securities issued by JPMorgan Chase & Co. ("JPMorgan Chase"), with a return linked to the performance of the EURO STOXX 50[®] Index (the "Index"). If the Index Return is positive, JPMorgan Chase will repay your principal amount at maturity and pay a return equal to the Index Return times the Multiplier of 2.00, up to the Maximum Gain of 47.16%. If the Index Return is zero or negative and the Final Index Level is greater than or equal to the Trigger Level, JPMorgan Chase will repay your principal amount at maturity. However, if the Index Return is negative and the Final Index Level is less than the Trigger Level, JPMorgan Chase will repay less than your principal amount at maturity, if anything, resulting in a loss of principal that is proportionate to the negative Index Return. Investing in the Securities involves significant risks. You may lose some or all of your principal amount. You will not receive dividends or other distributions paid on any stocks included in the Index, and the Securities will not pay interest. The contingent repayment of principal applies only if you hold the Securities to maturity. Based on current market conditions, in the opinion of our special tax counsel it is reasonable to treat the Securities as "open transactions" that are not debt instruments for U.S. federal income tax purposes, as more fully described in "Material U.S. Federal Income Tax Consequences — Tax Consequences to U.S. Holders — Notes Treated as Open Transactions That Are Not Debt Instruments" in the accompanying product supplement no. UBS-1a-I. Assuming this treatment is respected, the gain or loss on your Securities should be treated as long-term capital gain or loss if you hold your Securities for more than a year, whether or not you are an initial purchaser of Securities at the issue price. However, the IRS or a court may not respect this treatment, in which case the timing and character of any income or loss on the Securities could be materially and adversely affected. In addition, in 2007 Treasury and the IRS released a notice requesting comments on the U.S. federal income tax treatment of "prepaid forward contracts" and similar instruments. The notice focuses in particular on whether to require investors in these instruments to accrue income over the term of their investment. It also asks for comments on a number of related topics, including the character of income or loss with respect to these instruments; the relevance of factors such as the nature of the underlying property to which the instruments are linked; the degree, if any, to which income (including any mandated accruals) realized by non-U.S. investors should be subject to withholding tax; and whether these instruments are or should be subject to the "constructive ownership" regime, which very generally can operate to recharacterize certain long-term capital gain as ordinary income and impose a notional interest charge. While the notice requests comments on appropriate transition rules and effective dates, any Treasury regulations or other guidance promulgated after consideration of these issues could materially and adversely affect the tax consequences of an investment in the Securities, possibly with retroactive effect. You should consult your tax adviser regarding the U.S. federal income tax consequences of an investment in the Securities, including possible alternative treatments and the issues presented by this notice.

Withholding under legislation commonly referred to as "FATCA" may (if the Securities are recharacterized as debt instruments) apply to amounts treated as interest paid with respect to the Securities, as well as to the payment of gross proceeds of a sale of a Security occurring after December 31, 2016 (including redemption at maturity). You should consult your tax adviser regarding the potential application of FATCA to the Securities.

Key Risks

An investment in the Securities involves significant risks. Investing in the Securities is not equivalent to investing directly in the Index. These risks are explained in more detail in the "Risk Factors" section of the accompanying product supplement no. UBS-1a-I and the "Risk Factors" section of the accompanying underlying supplement no. 1a-I. We also urge you to consult your investment, legal, tax, accounting and other advisers before you invest in the Securities.

Risks Relating to the Securities Generally

- Your Investment in the Securities May Result in a Loss The Securities differ from ordinary debt securities in that we will not necessarily repay the full principal amount of the Securities. If the Index Return is negative, we will pay you the principal amount of your Securities in cash only if the Final Index Level has not declined below the Trigger Level. If the Index Return is negative and the Final Index Level is less than the Trigger Level, you will be exposed to the full decline of the Index and will lose some or all of your principal amount in an amount proportionate to the negative Index Return. Accordingly, you could lose up to your entire principal amount.
- Credit Risk of JPMorgan Chase & Co. The Securities are unsecured and unsubordinated debt obligations of the issuer, JPMorgan Chase & Co., and will rank *pari passu* with all of our other unsecured and unsubordinated obligations. The Securities are not, either directly or indirectly, an obligation of any third party. Any payment to be made on the Securities, including any repayment of principal, depends on the ability of JPMorgan Chase & Co. to satisfy its obligations as they come due. As a result, the actual and perceived creditworthiness of JPMorgan Chase & Co. may affect the market value of the Securities and, in the event JPMorgan Chase & Co. were to default on its obligations, you may not receive any amounts owed to you under the terms of the Securities and you could lose your entire investment.
- **The Appreciation Potential of the Securities Is Limited by the Maximum Gain** The appreciation potential of the Securities is limited by the Maximum Gain of 47.16%. Accordingly, the appreciation potential of the Securities will be limited by the Maximum Gain even if the Index Return times the Multiplier is greater than the Maximum Gain.
- The Multiplier Applies Only if You Hold the Securities to Maturity You should be willing to hold your Securities to maturity. If you are able to sell your Securities prior to maturity in the secondary market, if any, the price you receive likely will not reflect the full economic value of the Multiplier or the Securities themselves, and the return you realize may be less than the product of the performance of the Index and the Multiplier and may be less than the Index return, even if that return is positive and does not exceed the Maximum Gain. You can receive the full benefit of the Multiplier, subject to the Maximum Gain, only if you hold your Securities to maturity.

- The Contingent Repayment of Principal Applies Only If You Hold the Securities to Maturity If you are able to sell your Securities in the secondary market, if any, prior to maturity, you may have to sell them at a loss relative to your initial investment even if the closing level of the Index is above the Trigger Level. If you hold the Securities to maturity, JPMorgan Chase will repay your principal amount as long as the Final Index Level is not below the Trigger Level. However, if the Index Return is negative and the Final Index Level is less than the Trigger Level, JPMorgan Chase will repay less than the principal amount, if anything, resulting in a loss that is proportionate to the decline in the level of the Index from the Trade Date to the Final Valuation Date. The contingent repayment of principal based on whether the Final Index Level is below the Trigger Level applies only at maturity.
- No Interest Payments JPMorgan Chase will not make any interest payments to you with respect to the Securities.
- Potential Conflicts We and our affiliates play a variety of roles in connection with the issuance of the Securities, including acting as calculation agent and hedging our obligations under the Securities and making the assumptions used to determine the pricing of the Securities and the estimated value of the Securities when the terms of the Securities are set, which we refer to as JPMS's estimated value. In performing these duties, our economic interests and the economic interests of the calculation agent and other affiliates of ours are potentially adverse to your interests as an investor in the Securities. In addition, our business activities, including hedging and trading activities, could cause our economic interests to be adverse to yours and could adversely affect any payment on the Securities and the value of the Securities. It is possible that hedging or trading activities of ours or our affiliates in connection with the Securities could result in substantial returns for us or our affiliates while the value of the Securities. Please refer to "Risk Factors Risks Relating to Conflicts of Interest" in the accompanying product supplement no. UBS-1a-I for additional information about these risks.
- The Probability That the Final Index Level Will Fall Below the Trigger Level on the Final Valuation Date Will Depend on the Volatility of the Index "Volatility" refers to the frequency and magnitude of changes in the level of the Index. Greater expected volatility with respect to the Index reflects a higher expectation as of the Trade Date that the Index could close below its Trigger Level on the Final Valuation Date of the Securities, resulting in the loss of some or all of your investment. However, an index's volatility can change significantly over the term of the Securities. The level of the Index could fall sharply, which could result in a significant loss of principal.
- JPMS's Estimated Value of the Securities Is Lower Than the Original Issue Price (Price to Public) of the Securities JPMS's estimated value is only an estimate using several factors. The original issue price of the Securities exceeds JPMS's estimated value of the Securities because costs associated with selling, structuring and hedging the Securities are included in the original issue price of the Securities. These costs include the selling commissions, the projected profits, if any, that our affiliates expect to realize for assuming risks inherent in hedging our obligations under the Securities and the estimated cost of hedging our obligations under the Securities. See "JPMS's Estimated Value of the Securities" in this amended and restated pricing supplement.
- JPMS's Estimated Value Does Not Represent Future Values of the Securities and May Differ from Others' Estimates JPMS's estimated value of the Securities is determined by reference to JPMS's internal pricing models when the terms of the Securities are set. This estimated value is based on market conditions and other relevant factors existing at that time and JPMS's assumptions about market parameters, which can include volatility, dividend rates, interest rates and other factors. Different pricing models and assumptions could provide valuations for Securities that are greater than or less than JPMS's estimated value. In addition, market conditions and other relevant factors in the future may change, and any assumptions may prove to be incorrect. On future dates, the value of the Securities could change significantly based on, among other things, changes in market conditions, our creditworthiness, interest rate movements and other relevant factors, which may impact the price, if any, at which JPMS would be willing to buy Securities from you in secondary market transactions. See "JPMS's Estimated Value of the Securities" in this amended and restated pricing supplement.
- JPMS's Estimated Value Is Not Determined by Reference to Credit Spreads for Our Conventional Fixed-Rate Debt The internal funding rate used in the determination of JPMS's estimated value of the Securities generally represents a discount from the credit spreads for our conventional fixed-rate debt. The discount is based on, among other things, our view of the funding value of the Securities as well as the higher issuance, operational and ongoing liability management costs of the Securities in comparison to those costs for our conventional fixed-rate debt. If JPMS were to use the interest rate implied by our conventional fixed-rate credit spreads, we would expect the economic terms of the Securities to be more favorable to you. Consequently, our use of an internal funding rate would have an adverse effect on the terms of the Securities and any secondary market prices of the Securities. Example 1 — The level of the Index increases by 5% from the Initial Index Level of 100 to the Final Index Level of 105.

Because the Multiplier of 2.00 times the Index Return of 5% is less than the Maximum Gain of 47.16%, JPMorgan Chase will pay you your principal amount *plus* a return equal to the Index Return *times* the Multiplier, resulting in a payment at maturity of \$11 per \$10 principal amount Security, calculated as follows:

\$10.00 + (\$10.00 × Index Return × Multiplier) \$10.00 + (\$10.00 × 5.00% × 2.00) = \$11.00

Example 2 — The level of the Index increases by 60% from the Initial Index Level of 100 to the Final Index Level of 160.

Because the Multiplier of 2.00 times the Index Return of 60% is greater than the Maximum Gain of 47.16%, JPMorgan Chase will pay you your principal amount *plus* a return equal to the Maximum Gain of 47.16%, resulting in a payment at maturity of \$14.716 per \$10 principal amount Security, calculated as follows:

Example 4 — The level of the Index decreases by 60% from the Initial Index Level of 100 to the Final Index Level of 40.

Because the Index Return is -60% and the Final Index Level is less than the Trigger Level of 75, JPMorgan Chase will pay you a payment at maturity of \$4.00 per \$10 principal amount Security, calculated as follows:

This opinion is given as of the date hereof August 27, 2015 and is limited to the federal laws of the United States of America, the laws of the State of New York and the General Corporation Law of the State of Delaware. In addition, this opinion is subject to customary assumptions about the trustee's authorization, execution and delivery of the indenture and its authentication of the Securities and the validity, binding nature and enforceability of the indenture with respect to the trustee, all as stated in the letter of such counsel dated November 7, 2014, which was filed as an exhibit to the Registration Statement on Form S-3 by us on November 7, 2014.
